
FALL EDITION - BUILDING OUR MEMBERSHIP

Dear Fellow Scout Leaders,

As we transition into fall, children head back to school, and the new program year begins with excitement of what lays ahead for Cub Pack, Scouts BSA, Venturing, and Sea Scout meetings!

Rally your unit leaders and parents to take advantage of all the fall youth recruitment support materials that Samoset has to offer for your Scouting unit. Go to http://www.samoset.org/recruitment to see the overview of items available. Contact the Scout Office at 715-355-1450 if you need resources.

Ensure to handout your program calendar during your joining event so that all the new Scouts and parents know the fun and adventure that awaits them!

Thursday, September 22 is Join Scouting night. This is to ensure we have a single marketing message as we promote fall recruiting, and all resources can point to this culminating event. We know not all Scout units can have their event on this evening but having it on or before this date is important to ensure we take advantage of the marketing and social media blitz that is supporting recruitment efforts. You know how Scouting has positively impacted you, your family and your community. We want to draw your attention to how all our registered members... Scouts, Adults and Parents can positively impact the fall recruitment campaign:

- Ensure at least 2 volunteers in your Scouting unit are trained for fall youth.
- Place a Scouting yard sign at your local elementary or middle school and posters in them with the date/ time/location of the recruiting event.
- Communicate with your unit families on how they can help promote your Scouting unit. Reference the unit recruiting materials as well as the "bring a friend" recruiting incentive recognition for current Scouts to earn when they recruit their friends.
- Facilitate a positive relationship with the local schools your Scout unit recruits from. Foster an atmosphere of collaboration through a service project for the school. Have your unit represented for more than just the August Open house/Back to School Event. Is there a fall festival/carnival? Does the School have a food shelf that Scout unit parents could volunteer at?
- Can you connect with religious institutions in the unit service area to seek out promotional opportunities... posters, flyer distribution?
- What type of Social Media Campaign can your parents and members send out on the Scout units' behalf?
- What does your unit have for a website? Can you post simple activity photos or YouTube videos of your Scouts in Action to help promote your unit?
- Do you have connections with businesses in town that may allow a Scouting recruitment message on their digital marquee? Coordinate with other Scout units in the area.
- Tell the parents you know with Scout age children how much the program impacted you, and your family. There is nothing better than a heartfelt testimonial!
- Ask for help if you need it by contacting your unit serving executive at the Scout office.

As a volunteer in Samoset Council, you are never alone. Your excitement and enthusiasm for Scouting combined with the help and resources available from Samoset Council is the winning combination we need to be the best thing going for youth in our communities. 

UPDATE YOUR 'BE A SCOUT' PIN FOR SUCCESSFUL MEMBERSHIP GROWTH

BeAScout is an online site that prospective members can use to find a unit near them.

Updating your BeAScout.org "pin" is simple, and it's a good way to make sure your information is current.

It's called a "pin" because when families search BeAScout.org and ask to find Scout units within a certain number of miles around their address, the answers are listed next to a map with what looks like pins marking the location of each unit.



- In the drop-down menu, select your unit, then Organization Manager.
- On the next screen, select Unit Pin on the lefthand side to see the fields you can update.
- Enter all the updated information for your unit and then click save at the bottom of the screen.
- Note that it may take a few hours, or up to overnight, for the updated information to show up.
- If you'd like a more detailed step-by-step guide, scan the QR code.

MARKETING COMMITTEE FOCUSES ON SOCIAL MEDIA, RADIO CAMPAIGNS TO BOOST FALL MEMBERSHIP

The Samoset Council's Marketing Committee has been hard at work planning and executing a Fall marketing recruiting campaign that includes targeted radio commercials as well as targeted social media ads and video.

With a spend match from NRG Media, the Council is able to expand the radio campaign to include more airtime and a longer commercial.

Starting September 12 (leading up to Join Night September 22), 30 second ads will air on 107.9 Big Cheese and Y106.5 Today's Best Country.




POPCORN SALES, IMPORTANT DATES TO REMEMBER

'STEAM EXPLORES' DEBUTS AT SAMOSET COUNCIL

STEAM Explorers is a brand new program offered to families in North-Central Wisconsin through Samoset Council. We focus on giving children hands-on, exciting STEAM opportunities that they might not get in a traditional classroom.

Our aim is to encourage each child's curiosity and inspire them to explore the world around them. We work on moving away from memorization towards a more holistic, project-based curriculum that sparks students' imagination and develops their real-world skills.

Each "Lab" will consist of boys and girls in 2nd-5th grade. The Lab will be led by a trained adult volunteer, who will choose one Module to focus on during the Fall and one Module to focus on in the Spring. The Module choices for the 2022 school year are:

- Greenhouses
- Forensics
- Wind PowerRockets

In addition to activities focused on a specific topic,

youth will also engage in activities that promote the Scout Oath and Law (for example, a service project) and hear from local community experts.

This program is intended to be a fun supplement to a youth already in Scouts, or an opportunity for non-Scouting youth who aren't interested in our traditional programs. Registration is \$100 for the full year, and Labs will begin in October.

COUNCIL EXECUTIVE BOARD WORKS TO UPDATE 2022-2023 GOALS

On July 20 the Council Executive Board and Staff participated in a one-day retreat focused on the council strategic plan and updating our goals for 2022-2023.

The plan includes the same two pillars we had in our last plan as they are vitally important:

 Increase the Number of Youth Served – within this pillar there are objectives that support units in youth recruitment & marketing, training adult leaders, and safety. Financial Sustainability – this includes objectives in diversifying our income sources, developing more programs to encourage community youth to participate, as well as evaluating our property program utilization in order to determine needs and improvements to increase Scout and community use.

We will continue to refine the plan into early September with the goal of the Executive Board reviewing the plan at their September meeting for approval.
